HMH Into Reading TX v2 is a comprehensive K–5 English Language Arts curriculum grounded in evidence-informed best practices for structured literacy. The program delivers dynamic whole-class instruction, small-group rotations, and independent practice—all aligned to Texas standards and paced for skill mastery.

Built on research and guided by explicit, systematic instruction, HMH Into Reading emphasizes all critical components of literacy aligned to the Science of Reading: phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, writing, and text-based comprehension that builds content knowledge across grade levels.

Foundational skills lessons follow a systematic scope and sequence and include explicit instruction in phonemic awareness, decoding, spelling, and handwriting. A robust collection of decodable readers enables students to practice sound-spelling patterns in connected text daily. In grades K–2, lessons focus on developing early phonemic awareness and phonics skills, while in grades 3–5, the emphasis shifts to advanced word study, including syllabication, morphology, multisyllabic words, and complex phoneme-grapheme correspondences.

Each three-week module integrates reading and writing through text sets featuring award-winning authentic trade literature, covering science and social studies topics, and exposing students to a variety of genres throughout the school year. Daily lessons are streamlined, aligned to Texas standards, and paced so students engage in grade-level content in meaningful ways to maximize learning.

HMH Into Reading TX v2 provides resources to support all learners in both whole-class and small-group instruction. Teacher’s Guide support notes offer recommendations for differentiation for multilingual learners, striving readers, and advanced learners. Tabletop Minilessons for Reading and English Language Development provide additional small-group support to meet the diverse needs of Texas students.

Formative and summative assessments on HMH’s digital learning platform, Ed, monitor progress toward TEKS mastery and recommend both content and groupings for all learners.

HMH Into Reading TX v2 and HMH ¡Arriba la Lectura! TX v2 can be used in dual language classrooms to support Reading Language Arts in both English and Spanish. Planning support is also available to facilitate a variety of dual implementation models.
